


One of our Objectives is:

ABODE FOR LORD VENKATESWARA

- Having gone through Covid-19 for the last two years, we are now in a place able to formally start the project for building the Heavenly abode for Sri Venkateswara Swamy temple of Wellington
- We have undertaken initial planning and developed a set of Principles to guide us through this project. This has been discussed among the trustees and agreed.
- We considered several names for this project and chose 'Mahi Tahi'. It is a Maori word which means partnership, work together. 'Vishwakarma' is another name we plan to use downstream when we commence the actual build.
- This is no doubt is a **complex and challenging** undertaking for SDPST. This is **multi-disciplinary** and requires collaborating with several disciplines such as Engineering, Spiritual, Legal, Financial etc.
- We consider this a multi-generational opportunity to take time and "think big". A key Principle we will adopt is to co-design with community.
- Our immediate Next Steps are to undertake community engagement for a time-boxed period of 6-months. This is required to do some of the foundational work before we can confidently answer some key questions of costs and schedule.



ABODE FOR LORD VENKATESWARA

- We have identified various functional areas that are required to provide vital input for this foundational undertaking.
- We are seeking expressions of interest from the community for your time, participation and valuable input.
- We plan to follow a structured process in the form of workshops, primarily face-to-face.
 There will also be a facility put in place for offline input from wider community, such as email, portal etc.
- The focus of these workshops will be to come up with innovative ideas to tackle some of the key design decisions that we can then filter down to the best ones. These decisions will form the basis for a blueprint which serves as a comprehensive guide to making better choices while avoiding common errors.
- We have identified some initial functional areas for your consideration and solicit your expression of interest to shape the design of this functional area. We request that you please register your name and contact number for the respective functional area.
